As we move toward the end of our Easter season and into the beginning of the month of May, I would like to thank everyone involved in any and all of our ministries here at Good Shepherd. I know that I have not been with you through the summer yet, but I have been quite impressed by all that the people of this church do. This leads me to my topic for this ECHO article.

What kind of Christian are you?

Some may take this question to task, but it is legitimate and quite revealing to find out what kind of Christian one is.

To start with we can determine if you are an active or passive Christian. Active Christians take to heart the passage in Matthew 25 about the sheep and the goats. When we find someone hungry, thirsty, naked, an alien, ill or in prison, we DO something about it. We feed, give something to drink, clothe, welcome, and visit. And Jesus tells us we will be blessed.

A passive Christian takes to heart the fact that one is saved through belief. John 3:16 tells us *for God so loved the world that he sent his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but may have eternal life*. Not a lot of doing anything but certainly believing in Christ Jesus.

A balanced Christian will say I believe in Jesus of Nazareth and that God sent him to us AND because of my love for him I DO acts of love for all I meet.

We might also ask ourselves if we are Old Testament Christians or New Testament Christians. New Testament Christians take to heart all that Jesus preached. NT Christians also go to the letters of Paul, Peter, Jude, John, and James which describes for the first century Christians how we are supposed to follow in *the way* of Christ Jesus.

Old Testament Christians will be able to cite the passages that say *thou shalt not*. The giving of the Law was of extreme importance for the people of God and rules were made so that those laws can be applied to our daily lives.

A balanced Christian understands that there is a narrow road that we walk in order to keep the laws of the Old Testament and remain in the freedom of the New Testament. One rule I use is the Micah 6:8 rule which states *[God] has told you, O mortal, what is good and what does the LORD require of you, but to DO justice, to LOVE kindness, and to walk humbly with your God*. This is Old Testament prophesying with a New Testament feel. This IS my favorite Bible verse and it incorporates all that I believe into one easy to remember verse.

Some may think, "Wait! This is work's righteousness that you are advocating." My response is this: Paul tells us that we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. I believe that. But, we are saved for a purpose: To spread the Good News through all that we do, to be an example to others. Paul was railing against works of the Law and how they fall short when it comes to make us righteous. But, Paul also tells us that we are now in a position to do works of love for those around us. Jesus is the completion of the Law. Through Jesus we are justified before God because of our faith in him. But, Jesus tells us that all of the Law and everything that the prophets spoke to us can be distilled into one easy lesson: Love God with all your heart, mind, strength, and soul and love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus does not say, *thou shalt not*, but do. Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

Simple, but it's so hard to DO.

A Moment In Faith

Jesus says in John 14, "Peace I leave with you. My Peace I give to you, not as the world gives, give I to you. Don't let your heart be troubled, neither let it be fearful".

We need peace don't we? The world has changed over the years, and life is far more complicated in the 21st century than it has been in the centuries past. Families seemed closer and got by on just one income, and kids had fun with other kids outside playing rather than inside watching TV and playing video games alone. Today, it takes the salary of two people to raise a family. There is never enough time to do all that we want with the children because we are trying to burn the candle at both ends. In single parent families the stress is even worse and there never seems to be enough time or money to do many things. Remember what Jesus says, "My Peace to you, not as the world gives, I give to you. Don't let your heart be troubled, neither let it be fearful".

Wouldn't it be wonderful to have that kind of peace? Not to be worried! Not to be afraid! Even the kids need peace. They don't want to listen to their parents fight. They don't want to live in an out of control household. They don't want other kids to take their things. They don't want violence at school. Even kids who want a little excitement also need a little peace.

A teacher gave a group of kids in junior high a project to do. They each were to make a banner out of burlap and colored felt. They were given a chance to look at a catalog for ideas. The teacher thought many of them would copy an idea from the catalog, but strangely enough no one did, and out of 20 kids 18 made a banner on the same theme. Can you guess what it was? Well it was "Peace". That was a popular word with the young at that time, because many of them had seen their dads and moms go off to serve in the service, and they didn't want that to happen again. They just wanted "Peace".

It's a blessing that the peace that Jesus offers is not like the peace that the world gives. Jesus offers a different kind of peace. He doesn't draw a line in the sand to keep us apart. He draws a circle to bring us all together. The New Testament says that Jesus "has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us". (Ephesians 2:14). In Galatians 3:28 it says: There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. That really works you know! It really works among people who love Jesus. We become brothers and sisters in Christ, and we have a fellowship that we could not have imagined outside of Christ.

In John 14:23-29 there is even more to the peace that Jesus gives. Jesus talks about sending the Holy Spirit to live among us, to dwell within us. And so we have peace within ourselves, because God is with us. That gives us confidence. What Paul says, "If God is for us, who is against us". What this means is, if God is for us, it doesn't matter who is against us. If God is for us, we will prevail! That doesn't mean that we won't suffer. It doesn't mean that we will not die. It does mean that we will prevail both in this world and in the next. In this world, our sacrifices for Christ will bear fruit. In the next world, our sacrifices for Christ will be rewarded in ways we can't begin to imagine. The Lord will bless us beyond blessing. Finally Jesus says, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word. My Father will love him, and we will come to him, and make our home with him". What does it mean to keep Jesus' word? The most important answer to that question is that keeping Jesus' word means loving one another. Jesus says in John 13, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another". In John 15 Jesus says, "This is my commandment, that you love one another". In obeying Jesus' commandment to love one another, we will help each other to experience the peace of Christ. Our love will make life a little easier, more pleasant, more secure, and a bit more peaceful for the person whom we love. In the Beatitudes, Jesus says, "Blessed are the peacemakers", but I believe that in the Gospel of John, we are called to be peace givers. Ask yourselves what have you done recently to help Christ bring peace on earth and what will you do in the days that lay ahead?

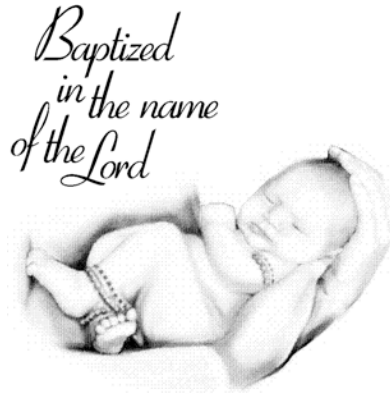
