Pastor's Page July 2016

Matthew 5:44-46 (NRSV)

⁴⁴ But, I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have?

I feel sad. I also feel ashamed. I think that we are becoming numb. We are starting to NOT feel and that is the worst feeling of all. Thinking that this is just the way it is in this country; waking up one morning to yet another mass killing in yet another part of this country. But this one is different. This one is confusing. This one sends multiple messages or so the media says. But, this one is still about someone that hates. This one is about another American born terrorist that was able to purchase an automatic rifle which was meant for the theater of war. This one was an attack on a gay nightclub in Orlando, Florida. This one happens to have a Muslim upbringing.

I did notice, though, that the people who frequented this night club bleed the same color red as school children in Connecticut, holiday revelers in California, and many other venues with other age groups or religious backgrounds in many other states. This one felt different because the gunman specifically singled out the LGBT community; a community that has had a long and painful history of being singled out to receive another's hate.

The LGBT community is strong. Things like this make them stronger. But, things like this still make them fear and ask why. And there is no answer. There is no answer to why white folk still hate black folk. There is no answer why southerners still hate northerners. There is no answer why people who are different need to have such a visceral reaction to groups of people who just want to get along in a society that is supposed to be made for everyone.

Even though whites hating blacks has come to the forefront because we finally have an African American president, we all know and most of us feel that hating because of one's skin color makes us, or is suppose to make us, personas non grata: people who are not welcomed. I fear now for women, Muslims, Native Americans, Jews, Arabs, and any OTHER that would like to be the first one of their ilk to be President of the United States, because the underlying refusal to consider them free and equal hasn't yet caught up to the Kingdom of God's open door policy; where we are all to be considered made in the image of God.

We talk about race but there is no race except the human race. Flashback to Genesis chapter one: We are ALL made in the image and likeness of God.

We talk about male and female. Flash forward to Paul: There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus.


We talk about sinners and non sinners. Flash forward to St. Paul: We have all sinned and have fallen short of the glory of God. Flash forward again to St. John: If we say we have not sinned, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. We call God a liar. Flash back again to the gospel of John: Jesus did not condemn the woman caught in adultery. Neither then did the other religious leaders at that time.

Change: that hated and perverse idea that we never go backward in time, only forward.

To go forward, we need to change. We need to change our hearts, minds, and attitudes. We need to change our way of seeing each other. We need to change the fear of OTHER to the welcoming grace of God. We must move forward. We must.

A Moment In Faith

“Hi, how are you?” “Fine.” This is not exactly an “in depth” discussion, but this brief interchange is normal as friends pass and briefly touch each other with a cliché or two. Actually, clichés are a way of life, often parts of sentences and paragraphs. But if this is the sum of our communicating with others, our relationships will all be superficial. Facts and opinions also fill our conversations. These words go deeper, but the true person still lies hidden beneath them. Only in reality, when honest feelings and emotions are shared can real people be known, loved, and helped.

Often, these patterns of superficial communication spill over into our talks with God. How easy it is for us to slide through well-worn lines of prayers we've recited for decades, or how easy we toss a cliché or two at God and call it prayer! We don't have to worry though because God hears and understands these feeble attempts by limiting the depth of our communication, we become shallow in our relationship with Him. But God knows us, and He wants to have meaningful communication with us!

At the center of the Bible is the Book of Psalms. It is a great collection of songs and prayers expressing the heart and soul of humanity. In them we find a whole range of human experiences expressed. There are no clichés in this book. Instead David and other writers poured out their true feelings honestly, reflecting a dynamic, powerful and life-changing friendship with God. These writers of Psalms confess their sins, express their doubts and fears, and ask God for help in times of trouble and praise and worship Him.

As you read the Book of Psalms, you will hear believers crying out to God from the depths of despair, and you will hear them singing to Him in joyful celebration. Whether these writers are despairing or rejoicing, you will always hear them sharing honest feelings with their God. Because of their honesty, men and women throughout history have come, again and again, to the book of Psalms for comfort during times of struggle and distress. Through the Psalms, they have risen from the depths of despair to new heights of joy and praise as they discovered the power of God's love and forgiveness. Let that honesty guide you into a deep and genuine relationship with God.

We can see five major themes in the book of Psalms. **First is Praise:** By focusing our thoughts on God it moves us to praise Him. The more we know Him, the more we can appreciate what He has done for us.

Second is **God's power:** When we feel powerless, God can help us. His strength can overcome the despair of any pain or trial. We can always pray that He will deliver, protect, and sustain us.

Third is **Forgiveness:** Because God forgives us, we can pray to Him honestly and directly. When we receive his forgiveness, we move from alienation to intimacy, from guilt to love.

Fourth is **Thankfulness:** When we realize how we benefit from knowing God, we can fully express our thanks to Him. By thanking Him often, we will develop spontaneity in our prayer life.

Fifth is **Trust:** People can be unfair and friends may desert us, but we can trust God, knowing God intimately drives away doubt, fear, and loneliness. Remember, when we put our trust in God, He will quiet our hearts! Read the Book of Psalms and enjoy this great collection of songs and prayers.

Don't tell God how big the mountain is. Tell the mountain how big God is!

When Pastor first asked if Dick and I would consider going to the Synod Assembly in Akron, our immediate response was, “We just can’t spend the time away”. It seems many of us get so caught up in our daily lives with work and family that we can come up with any number of excuses of why not to spend a couple days away for our Pastor and our church. So, after our guilt trip set in, we asked ourselves, why not? Maybe we could do that; after all, we can always find the time to go on vacation or to spend a weekend away, and everything always works out when we do. Your work will still be there or there’s someone else to handle the issue and our children do manage to survive without Mom and Dad to babysit, after all! Besides, wouldn’t it be interesting to see just what does happen beyond our church; to see how it all fits together and wouldn’t it be a great learning experience for us? So we told Pastor, “If you aren’t able to find anyone else, we would definitely be glad to go.”

And we are so glad we were able to have that experience. It was two days filled with worship, music and workshops where we were able to learn so much about the Synod and what all they are able to accomplish here and around the World with our donations. God's work. Our hands.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them." Genesis 1:27

We are killing ourselves. We believe that all people are created in God's image. All of humanity bears a family resemblance. Those murdered in Orlando were not abstract "others," they are us. But somehow, in the mind of a deeply disturbed gunman, the LGBTQ community was severed from our common humanity. This separation led to the death of 49 and the wounding of 54 of **us**.

We live in an increasingly divided and polarized society. Too often we sort ourselves into like-minded groups and sort others out. It is a short distance from division to demonization. Yesterday, we witnessed the tragic consequences of this.

There is another way. In Christ God has reconciled the world to God's self. Jesus lived among us sharing our humanity. Jesus died for us to restore our humanity. God invites us into this reconciling work. This must be our witness as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The perpetrator of this hate crime did not come out of nowhere. He was shaped by our culture of division, which itself has been misshapen by the manipulation of our fears. That is not who we are. St. Paul wrote, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation; everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new. All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ." (II Corinthians 5:17-20)

Our work begins now. We need to examine ourselves, individually and as a church, to acknowledge the ways we have divided and have been divided. We must stand with people who have been "othered". We must speak peace and reconciliation into the cacophony of hatred and division. We must live the truth that all people are created in God's image.

This morning your church wide staff came together to mourn and to pray. We prayed for those killed in Orlando and remembered the Charleston Nine killed only a year ago. We prayed for the family of the shooter, for our LGBTQ brothers and sisters and for our Muslim brothers and sisters who now face the threat of retaliation. And we prayed that the Prince of Peace will bring us to the day when we stop killing ourselves.
