## Grace to you and peace from God Our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ (NRSV 2 Thessalonians 1:2)

This is not the way Christians are supposed to be talking about each other. These are not the behaviors that Christ would want us to display. Remember that we are to emulate Christ Jesus in our lives. Even though that can be very difficult, it is still a laudable goal. I have already decided that I can circumvent my anxieties by voting early in Jefferson. Now, my vote is in and I can turn the TV off at any time, because I have made my peace with this election cycle. You can do the same. But when you do, make sure that people can see the face of Jesus in what you are doing.

November is upon us. Snow will be flying soon enough. The sun is hiding more and more every day. Evenings come much sooner and the morning takes longer to arrive. The colors of the season are emblazoned across the landscape. The lake looks a little angrier and the breezes are blowing a little harder. The sky is filled with gray, heavy clouds. This is life on the lake. When the clouds break and the sun reflects off of the leaves and glistening branches, we get a glimpse of how glorious God's creation can be.

We, however, are living is a world that is broken and needs mending. Many times we are able to mend things. But, there are things that seem un-mendable. One of those is our bodies which wears out and is prone to disease and aging. And sometimes those bodies are very young; too young. Our sister in Christ, Kelsey, is in that predicament now. She is much too young to be suffering from a tumor. But I am reminded that there are even children half her age or younger that are suffering. Their bodies are being ravaged by cancer cells. This is just us living in an imperfect world where DNA and viruses can control our flesh.

Our spirits, however, are in the realm of the holy with the Holy Spirit. *Christ in us* has a powerful way of transforming how we look at this world and all of its imperfections including DNA, viruses, and cancer. They can control our physical lives, our flesh, but cannot touch our spiritual selves. We must learn to live with what can happen to our flesh, but never have to give into that same narrative for our spirits. Our spirits are with and for Christ. It is through the Spirit, the Holy Spirit, that we can lean on Jesus for strength to get us through times of suffering and questions. Help us Jesus to feel your presence with us on a daily basis and sometimes an hourly basis.



To go to church or not go, we've all been there. At some time or another we seem to find any old excuse not to go to church. It might be a headache or maybe you were out late the night before or you might want to go out of town to go shopping or you might feel that nobody at church will miss you. Isn't it easy, so very easy, to find an excuse not to go to church? Maybe if we spent as much time looking for reasons to go to church instead of reasons not to go, our faith would have a chance to grow.

In order to grow spiritually, going to church is just as important as exercising for a healthy life. Our spiritual life needs to be healthy also, so that our relationship with God will grow and be healthy. I like going to church on Sunday because it makes me feel closer to God, it lifts my spirits, and it strengthens my faith. If we are to be serious about our faith, and grow in our spiritual life, what better place to be than at church with people who share the same interests and beliefs.

Many people say you don't need to go to church to be close to God, that you can just read the Bible and say prayers and get the same results. Well that may be true, just how many of us do that? It's like going to a meeting for alcohol addicts or a drug rehab program or a meeting where everyone is watching their weight. You need the support of those around you to get your life back on track and at church you get that same support and help from those worshipping with you. It really helps. It really does!

If we work hard to find a church where we can make a connection with others, we would find more ways to serve the Lord. When we have that connection we will also find that making a contribution to our church in some way will become easier and more fulfilling.

Church attendance according to a recent poll shows some interesting figures. It shows 80% of the people said that they were Christians but only 47% went to church on a regular basis. More revealing, was 31% admitted that they haven't been to church in the past 6 months unless it was for a funeral or a wedding. Among those who said they were Catholics, only 49% said they went to church weekly. For "born-again" Christians it was 59% and for those in the general Protestant category weekly attendance was fewer than 50%.

Some people might say, "I don't need someone preaching to me." That may be so but what you do need is someone reminding you about the dangers of gossip, about the need to be more patient with others, or the need to be more charitable with one another. These are all good things that you can get from the Pastor's messages on Sunday, and we still need to hear them from time to time. A good church is the place for that and a good church will supply the right medicine for what ails you spiritually. All you have to do is be willing to make the effort to attend church on a weekly basis. As an old television commercial said many years ago, "try it, you'll like it!"

Lord I do not ask for a faith that would move mountains.

I pray Lord for enough faith to move me.


