A Message from the President

Year 2021: Two Giant Steps Forward / Count Your Blessings

One year ago, I wrote that the year 2020 was one in which practically no one was sorry to see it come to an end. Our community, our country, and most of the world were in the tight grip of the COVID-19 pandemic. Hundreds of thousands of people in the United States died from it and the country was mired in a sharp recession brought on by the lock-down of our economy. Life was anything but normal; most school classrooms were closed to inperson learning, many restaurants and barber shops/hair salons could not open their doors, and employers either had people work from home (where possible) or shut down their businesses altogether. Some businesses did not survive and individual financial hardship was widespread. On top of that we at Good Shepherd were without a pastor. Last year at this time we did not have any prospective candidates on the horizon and the situation was not looking very promising. Our outlook in early 2021 was rather bleak.

Then came **the first good news**; scientists at Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson developed COVID vaccines in record time. Prior to those breakthroughs we were told that a vaccine may not be possible at all for this virus and, even if one could be discovered, it could take well over a year to develop and test in clinical trials before it could be administered to the public. In other words, it would take a miracle to be ready any sooner. But that 'miracle' did come true. My wife and I (and probably many of you) received our first and second shots in March and April. The impossible had happened! True, the vaccines are not 100% effective but for most people they greatly reduced both the infection rate and the severity of the disease.

That being said, we are not home safe by any means. All indications are that this disease will be with us for the foreseeable future. Currently, much of the country is experiencing a surge in COVID infections, largely among the unvaccinated. In 2021 we had several of our members contract the disease but most survived it. The cases ranged from mild symptoms to lengthy hospitalizations with some nasty, lingering side-affects. The best way to protect yourself and others is to get vaccinated, if it is safe for you, and avoid contact with infected people.

Life in our community has returned to somewhat normal; our church is open for two in-person worship services each Sunday, the YMCA is holding exercise classes in Fellowship Hall Mon.-Wed.-Fri, there is line dancing Thursdays, and yoga on Friday. Restaurants, movie theaters, stores, libraries, factories, and offices are open and begging for workers. **Be thankful and count your blessings!**

The Call Committee's search for a new pastor was not going so well for the first three-quarters of the year. It did interview two potential candidates but determined that neither was the right fit for Good Shepherd. Then, **the second good news** came rather unexpectedly. A new graduate from Trinity Seminary expressed an interest in

serving a congregation in northeast Ohio. An in-person interview was arranged and within days the committee voted unanimously to recommend **Joshua Krenz** to the congregation. On November 21 our members voted overwhelmingly to extend a call to Josh, he accepted, and began his ministry on December 6. Wow, how quickly our fortunes changed! **Be thankful and count your blessings!**

Thank You Pastors Dave Anderson and Steve Fisher

When Pastor Patrick Van De Motter retired at the end of September, 2020, I quickly learned that there were no interim pastors available in northeast Ohio or northwest Pennsylvania. Even supply pastors were hard to come by. Then, to our rescue, came the two best supply pastors we could have asked for. Dave Anderson of Ashtabula and Steve Fisher of Perry, both retired after long and distinguished pastoral careers, each agreed to lead us in worship services two Sundays a month. They were absolutely wonderful in all respects. When we closed the church to in-person worship, they came on Saturday mornings to tape the service so it would be available to view Sunday mornings. On Christmas Eve 2020 we had the service broadcast live to car radios in the church parking lot. Ashes on Ash Wednesday were received in a 'drive-thru' manner under the carport. In the summer we resumed two in-person worship services; the 8:30 outside and the 10:30 inside. Both of them adjusted to our traditions as if they had been here all along. And, most importantly, they gave life to God's Word in some of the best sermons we have ever heard. We were truly blessed to have them in our midst for fourteen months while we searched for a new pastor. We will be forever grateful for their ministry.

Congregation Meeting January 23, 2022 after the 11:00 Service

We will hold an in-person congregation meeting on January 23 after the 11:00 worship service. The agenda, at this time, is;

- 1. To vote on the 2022 budget.
- 2. To vote on the church council nominees.
- 3. A discussion and potential vote on our duplex rental house at 448-450 Sandusky Street.
- 4. Other potential business.

In regard to the Sandusky Street property, church council has authorized a thorough electrical inspection by a licensed electrician to determine what work will be necessary to make that electrical system safe and in compliance with the code. The house was built in 1915 and much of the wiring is believed to be original and may not be capable of meeting the electrical needs of modern-day appliances. At this time, we are not certain we will have the electrician's report by January 23. In addition, we are planning to replace all windows (also original) and floor coverings. If we do have all the information available, we will share it with you and have a full discussion so you are well informed to make a decision. The vote will determine whether or not to authorize the improvements or to sell the property. This issue must come before the congregation because the total cost of the improvements exceeds council's spending limit. If we vote to approve the work, all expenses will be paid from the Capital Improvement Endowment Fund.



Pastor Joshua Krenz

By now we all know Pastor Joshua Krenz started with his first day in the church office on Monday, December 06, 2021. The week before was a whirlwind of activity trying to get the pastor's office space into a suitable condition. After a good cleaning, attempts were made to get the current computers up and running and an office phone for our new pastor. Thanks to Dan Patriarco for his computer expertise and figuring out a work around to be able to get pastor set up and running. We also discovered the phone "jacks" in pastor's office had been deactivated. Great Wave Communications was notified to reconnect all the phone "jacks" in the church that were deactivated. Due to a shortage of employees out with illness, Great Wave was not able to get to the needs at GSLC until first thing Thursday, December 9.Thank you goes out to Jerry Lampela for meeting with the Great Wave Communications technician at the church and making sure all available phone connections were reactivated.

Pastor started his day by unloading his totally packed car filled with boxes of books and documents, as well as some personal office items. He moved in using a "dolly" that had flat tires, making the transition a little difficult. Nothing really seemed to frustrate Pastor that morning as he began this settling in process. Pastor jumped right into getting busy understanding his office and unpacking those boxes. Since we live close to the church you could see pastor was burning some late-night oil at the church from day one!

Pastor attended 3M's (Men's Maintenance Ministry), quilting, a concert at Conneaut High School, ate his dinners at local restaurants, attended nisua baking, met members of Conneaut City Council, said the invocation at a Conneaut City Council meeting, met the editor of The Conneaut Courier and set up an interview, gave an interview for Sunrise Live with Jim and gave a taped interview for Around the Town with Chuck that is scheduled to air on Conneaut Cable channel 6 the week of January 12 through 18. Pastor and I sat down to review some short-term goals and objectives for him as well as commitments of the congregation during his settling in period. These are pastor's goals and encouragement goals of the congregation that are attached to pastor's compensation package sent to the synod office for approval and signature of our Bishop.

Pastor's Special Attention goals are as follows:

- Become familiar with the congregation and build a positive relationship with the community of Conneaut.
- 2) Develop and implement a plan to rebuild the ministries of the church that have proven to drive growth at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Conneaut.
- 3) Keep congregation focused on our mission and begin to build a mutual vision for our future together.
- 4) Develop a visitation plan to encourage and understand talents and level of member involvement.
- 5) Develop plan to encourage youth at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Conneaut as well as an outreach plan to bring more young families to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Conneaut.

The Congregation will encourage and support pastor's ministry in the following ways:

- 1) Provide support and intentional Prayer for pastor and congregation.
- 2) Provide lay time and support allowing pastor time to become acclimated to the ministry and mission of the church.

- 3) Encourage wearing of name tags to help pastor put names to faces. Provide name tags where needed.
- 4) Invite pastor to participate in ministries where appropriate facilitating easier introduction to ministries.
- 5) Be open, encouraging and participative in new ideas with the pastor.

Oh and finally Pastor Joshua had two more "small" things to do during his first two weeks in his new role at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. He had to prepare and deliver two Sunday sermons and conduct four services. He also took some time to prepare his ordination as well as fly to New Mexico for his ordination leaving Conneaut on Wednesday evening after going to the NEO ELCA Synod office, arriving in New Mexico late Wednesday night, finish the preparations for his Ordination, become ordained on Friday and return "home" on Saturday and back in our pulpit on Sunday morning.
